


Monroe Harding was founded as a Presbyterian Orphanage in 1893 by Mrs. Fannie Harding, in memory of her husband, Dr. James Monroe Harding.

The purpose of Monroe Harding was to provide a home for children who did not have parents— or whose parents were unable to provide for them. Since our founding, Monroe Harding has helped almost 15,000 children. As programs for youth changed, Monroe Harding developed programs to reflect and serve the surrounding community.

Today the youth who are recipients of Fannie Harding's legacy either are, or have been in foster care. We provide the basics: food, clothing and shelter. But young people, especially those in foster care, need more than that. Therefore, Monroe Harding serves many more needs.

We provide foster homes, supportive housing, mentoring, relationship-building skills, safety and structure, encouragement, life skills training, education, job placement, and more. This gives every young person the opportunity to live a whole, happy, and independent life.

Just as in Fannie Harding's day, Monroe Harding still strives to give every child the opportunity to live a whole, happy and independent life. Monroe Harding makes the dreams of young people become their realities Healing happens here.

Opportunities to Give

Foster Care Program

Monroe Harding's Foster Care program provides safe, loving homes for children and youth who have experienced trauma, neglect, or abuse. This program works to match children with compassionate foster families who are trained and supported to help them heal and thrive. With a focus on permanency and well-being, the program offers comprehensive support, including case management, therapy, educational assistance, and enrichment opportunities to ensure every child has the chance to reach their full potential. Monroe Harding's Foster Care program also prioritizes sibling connections, cultural responsiveness, and lifelong family bonds whenever possible.

Financial contributions to the Foster Care program help address critical needs, including:

- Recruiting and training foster families: Ensuring foster parents are well-prepared to provide the care and stability children need.
- Therapy and counseling services: Specialized mental health support to help children process trauma and build resilience.
- Educational support and extracurricular activities: Providing tutoring, school supplies, and access to sports, arts, and other activities that foster development and confidence.
- Sibling connection: Supporting family visits, shared activities, and reunification efforts for siblings in care.
- Independent living preparation: Equipping older youth with life skills and resources to transition successfully out of care.

Supportive Housing Program

Monroe Harding's Supportive Housing program offers safe, affordable housing for young adults who have aged out of foster care and those experiencing homelessness. This program provides not just a place to live but a foundation for stability and self-sufficiency. Residents are connected with individualized case management, life skills training, education, and employment resources, helping them build a sustainable path toward independence. Supportive Housing addresses the unique challenges faced by these young adults, many of whom lack traditional safety nets, ensuring they have a safe environment and opportunities to thrive.

Financial support for the Supportive Housing program helps provide:

- Safe and stable housing: A secure place to call home is the foundation for young adults' success.
- Essential life skills training: Workshops on budgeting, cooking, and time management equip residents to thrive independently.
- Workforce development and education support: Financial aid for HiSet or high school diploma, college tuition, job training, and career advancement.
- Mental health and wellness resources: Access to counseling and community-building activities to address emotional and social needs.



Resource Center Program

Monroe Harding's Resource Center is a vital hub of support for young adults who have aged out of foster care or are experiencing homelessness. The center provides a welcoming space where youth can access essential services, gain life skills, and build a supportive community. The Resource Center offers individualized case management, education and employment assistance, financial literacy training, access to technology, food and hygiene supplies, and mental health resources. Through a holistic approach, the program empowers young adults to overcome barriers and achieve long-term stability and independence.

Your financial contributions to the Resource Center directly support these young adults by providing:

- Essential resources: Food, clothing, hygiene items, and transportation assistance to meet immediate needs.
- Education and job training: Access to HiSet programs, college readiness support, and workforce development opportunities.
- Life skills training: Workshops on budgeting, time management, and other critical skills for independent living.
- Mental health services: Counseling and peer support to address emotional and social wellbeing.
- Community-building activities: Opportunities to foster connection and a sense of belonging for youth who often feel isolated.

Additional Resource Center Programs

Financial Education

The Opportunity Passport program equips young adults aging out of foster care with the financial knowledge and resources to achieve long-term economic success. This program includes financial literacy training, matched savings accounts, and support in making major purchases such as housing or transportation.

Workforce Development

Works Wonder is designed to prepare youth for the workforce by offering job readiness training, internships, and employment opportunities. The program focuses on teaching essential skills such as resume building, interview techniques, and on-the-job training. Resource Center Programs Continued...

Healthy Relationship

The Healthy Relationships education program is designed to teach adolescents and young adults (typically ages 14-24) how to build healthy romantic relationships, prevent dating violence, and make informed decisions about sex by focusing on communication skills, self-awareness, and understanding healthy relationship dynamics.

Educational Support

Monroe Harding provides comprehensive educational support for adolescents and young adults, including HiSET preparation and guidance in applying for and accessing higher or post-secondary education. Our dedicated educators works closely with clients to help them achieve their academic goals and build a strong foundation for their future.

Monroe Gardens

Monroe Gardens connects young adults with nature through horticulture, while fostering community by building personal growth and marketable skills. Participants shape the program by deciding what to grow and sell, gaining hands-on experience and employment opportunities that prepare them for future careers. As a social enterprise, Monroe Gardens generates sustainable revenue to support Monroe Harding's programs.


